Our Shakespeare by the Bow program is under the direction of Haysam Kadri.

Shakespeare by the Bow's production of *A Midsummer Night's Dream* runs **June 27 - August 18, 2019 in Prince's Island Park** (NE corner of park next to the Memorial Drive pedestrian overpass).
