

t's been four years since a full production of Geoffrey Simon Brown's spectacular and playful adaptation of Charles Dickens' *A Christmas Carol* has graced our stage. A lot has happened since then (but let's not go there). This Christmas classic has been home to Theatre Calgary for 35 years. Dickens' tale of transformation never gets old, and in many ways, it is important for us to be reminded that miracles are possible, and people can change.

This adaptation of *Carol* remains faithful to Dickens' original novella (published in 1843) while also

embracing fresh elements, such as one of Calgary's favourite actors, Doug McKeag, playing the role of Scrooge. The first time I directed a show at Theatre Calgary was in 2018 on *The Secret Garden*. Doug played the role of Weatherstaff, and I fell in love with his generous spirit – not only as a performer but as a human being. I cannot wait for you all to experience his vivid Ebenezer Scrooge, as well as the extraordinary and talented group of new performers to this production.

The holidays are an opportunity for us to think beyond ourselves and stretch our hearts towards the needs of others. Dickens stated that the two most important characters in the story were the homeless children, Ignorance and Want. They still live on our streets, in every neighbourhood from Saskatoon to New York City to Birmingham, to just down the road from us. Geoffrey's adaptation shines a light on the themes of ignorance and want throughout the entire journey of this play, and allows us to see and hear outside of ourselves, and find empathy in our divided world.

Happy Holidays to you, and your friends, colleagues, and family. Enjoy the show.

### **PLAYWRIGHT'S NOTES**



he first time I read the original novella of A Christmas Carol I was struck by how timely it felt. Even though he was writing so specifically about the time he was living in – almost 200 years ago – it feels like Dickens tapped into something that we all seem to forget and need to be reminded of again and again: to pay attention to those around us; that we all belong to the same world.

When I first adapted A *Christmas Carol* for Theatre Calgary back in 2019, I spent a lot of time thinking about how, in an increasingly individualized world, with technology driven isolation and polarized politics dividing friends and family, it feels so vital that we can come together around a story to remind us of our shared humanity. Of course, over the

past four years – living through a pandemic, through the eruption of devastating global conflicts, through cost of living spiking at an alarming rate – those things have been put into hyperdrive. We have spent years separated from family, separated from friends, from community, and have come out the other side somehow more divided than before. I know so many people who have been left feeling scared, feeling angry, and those feelings can make it that much harder to feel connected to the larger world in which we live.

And so, in this time of uncertainty, I feel extraordinarily grateful to be able to gather together once more the full team of artists who brought this story to life on the Max Bell stage four Christmases ago and to perform this play that has been performed here every year for longer than I have been alive. It is such a joy and an honour to be invited into this tradition and this family, to get to create alongside such a large and inspiring band of Calgary artists, and to share this production with our city again this year.

I know that this play is a tradition for so many people and families in this city. I hope that this year's Carol can bring some normalcy to what has been a very unfamiliar past few years. And, for those who are experiencing this play for the first time, I hope you can find comfort and reflection in this story about redemption, resiliency, and change.

As we gather together in the theatre again, I hope this story can serve as a salve for our hearts and our sense of community. Thank you to Theatre Calgary for this tremendous opportunity and thank you for coming.




#### ALLISON LYNCH

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### A CHRISTMAS CAROL

"Marley was dead, to begin with." With those six words, Charles Dickens invited us into the world of *A Christmas Carol*, indelibly introducing us to Ebenezer Scrooge, the three ghosts of Christmas, Tiny Tim, and a full cast of memorable characters. Though he spent mere weeks writing it, Dickens' novella about the original Christmas Grinch has been a holiday staple for nearly two centuries, giving rise to countless adaptations for stage and screen. It was such an immediate hit, that barely a month after its debut, Dickens was embroiled in a legal fight against a publishing company that had printed pirated copies.

In the spirit of the season, here are some interesting facts you may not know about the Christmas classic.

**Did you know...** A Christmas Carol was just one of several Christmas-themed stories written by Charles Dickens. The novella's full title is A Christmas Carol. In Prose. Being a Ghost Story of Christmas.

**Did you know...** Dickens wrote the novella in just six weeks, under financial pressure. Reportedly Dickens wrote the story while taking hours-long nighttime walks around London.


**Did you know...** A Christmas Carol was first published on December 19, 1843, with the first edition sold out by Christmas Eve. By 1844, the novella had gone through 13 printings and continues to be a robust seller more than 175 years later.

**Did you know...** Dickens didn't make very much money from early editions of *A Christmas Carol*. Though it was a runaway best seller, Dickens was very fastidious about the endpapers and how the book was bound, and the price of materials took a big chunk out of his potential profits.

**Did you know...** Like many of Dickens' other works, *A Christmas Carol* was written as a work of social commentary. Dickens had a lifelong devotion to helping the underserved due to his own family's experiences with debtors' prison, which forced him to drop out of school as a boy and work at a factory. As Dickens' biographer Michael Slater described, the author thought of *A Christmas Carol* as a way to: "help open the hearts of the prosperous and powerful towards the poor and powerless...."

**Did you know...** Upon publishing the first edition of *A Christmas Carol*, Dickens had his 66-page heavily revised handwritten manuscript bound in crimson leather and decorated in gilt before gifting it to his friend—and creditor—Thomas Mitton, whose name was also inscribed on the cover in gilt.

**Did you know...** While A Christmas Carol was received favorably by many of Dickens' author peers, a 32-year-old Mark Twain was not a fan. Credited as the first writer to do reading tours of his work, Dickens read A Christmas Carol to American audiences during his second visit to the U.S. Twain's review of the now-iconic book? "There is no heart. No feeling—it is nothing but glittering frostwork.



### A Q&A WITH DARYL CLORAN, DIRECTOR OF *AS YOU LIKE IT*

#### Coming to Theatre Calgary February 27 to March 24, 2024



#### The Bard Meets The Beatles in a Mashed-Up Musical

It's the 1960s, and things are getting groovy in the Forest of Arden. Shakespeare's classic comedy of love and mistaken identity is given new life in this high-spirited adaptation featuring the music of The Beatles. When Rosalind is banished from court, she disguises herself as a man and escapes to the forest. There, she meets the similarly-banished Orlando, who happens to be in love with her, but cannot see through her disguise. From there, things get increasingly tangled as the play explores love and gender roles, infused with the music of the "Fab Four."

#### What led to the pairing of Shakespeare with The Beatles?

Christopher Gaze [Artistic Director of Bard on The Beach in Vancouver] asked me: if, hypothetically, we could get the rights to the Beatles music, what would I do with it? I was always a big fan of the Beatles, considering the Beatles in relationship to *As You Like It*, I realized so much of their music feels like it was written for that play. It was such a perfect fit.

The journey of the characters in *As You Like It* really mirrors the evolution of The Beatles' songwriting. The beginning of *As You Like It* is about these young, naive lovers. And so all of the early Beatles stuff, like "I Wanna Hold Your Hand," fits in that so nicely. But then when Shakespeare's characters head out into the forest, it becomes a much deeper play that asks much deeper questions, so the later Beatles writing starts to really apply.

#### What was it like to weave The Beatles' Music into Shakespeare's script?

First, I knew I had to cut about half of Shakespeare's text. I wanted these songs to do more than pause the story for a second to sing your favourite Beatles song. They had to help move the story forward and they had to take the place of some monologues. So much of the process involved finding places where the emotional content of each song serves a purpose. I was asking myself, how do we replace what was in the text and help move the emotional journey forward?

#### Has this play changed how you see either Shakespeare or The Beatles?

Yes it has. While we're singing Beatles songs, we are placing them in the mouth of a particular character. So that totally sort of how we approach a song, or what lens we're looking at it through. A good example is "Helter Skelter," which is a pretty dark Beatles song. We use it late in the play as quite a comic number: Touchstone uses it to scare off William, peacocking as he shouts across the stage.

I have learned not to be precious about Shakespeare. I really enjoy ripping the guts out of it. I think this adaptation of *As You Like It* can really introduce audiences to Shakespeare. We build a lot on the humour and characters that Shakespeare wrote.

For example, he wrote a wrestling match into this play. One of the oddest things about *As You Like It* is that it has a wrestling match in the middle of it. We were able to build this full wrestling pre show that sets the tone for the night. The audience walks in and like, there's wrestling happening already, and they're like, what's happening, what's happening?


